PASTOR'S MESSAGE

⁸Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. ¹⁰In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 1 John 4:8-10

Dear friends in Christ:

In our world today, people try to twist and distort the word "love" when we talk about what it means for God to love (and, by extension, what it means for Christians to love others). There are those who would have us believe that God's love is about accepting others without judgment, supporting them in whatever manner of life they may be living. But the Word of God presents a different view on God's love.

God's love is about His loving action to save us from sin. His love is shown in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. God the Father sends his very own Son – the perfect, sinless, second person of the Trinity – into human flesh that he would bear our sin, guilt, and shame on the tree of the cross and die. In the hymn *We Sing the Praise of Him Who Died* (LSB 429), Thomas Kelley writes that we see inscribed upon the cross the words "God is love" (stanza 2). The cross is the place where the love of God shines most brightly. God is not content to let us wallow in our sin. God is not content to let us fall ever deeper into our own depravity caused by sin. God acts in mercy and love by sending his Son to die.

God does not leave us to try to pull ourselves up by our own bootstraps. He does not wait to see if we can get ourselves together and live the life of perfection that holiness requires. He does not leave us alone or wait because he knows that we cannot do these things. We are sinners, and sinners cannot fix the problem of sin! So God, in his mercy, sends the Savior we need. "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8 ESV). And in Jesus' death, our guilt is taken

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - REJOICE!

⁷**And** the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. *Philippians 4:7*

Now is the time for us to reflect on the history of the beginning of Peace. Pastor Luther Strasen compiled a document ten years ago for our 65th anniversary. The following are two paragraphs from the document that explain our establishment as a congregation and why we are called Peace Evangelical Lutheran Church:

In the fall of 1945, members of Emmaus Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, Indiana, wrote to their fellow members that they were desirous of starting a new mission congregation in the farthest southwest area of the city ant the affirmed: "We are motivated solely by a desire to expand the Kingdom." Eventually the congregation became a reality and began proclaiming the Good News that Jesus Christ, as Zechariah exclaimed, is the "the sun from heaven "who by the tender mercies of God shines in the darkness of our worked to bring all People "into the path of peace through the forgiveness of sins. It is that path of peace that has been the purpose for Peace congregation's s existence and the path which it has progressed on for the past 65 years.

On January 27, 1946, the South Side Lutheran Mission formalized its existence as a congregation. In the weeks prior the Sunday bulletins had invited suggestion for what the new congregation might be

named, with the directive that the name should be one that "satisfies all the members, of which the can be proud, and which does justice to its cause." Faith, Good Shepherd, Bethany, Christ, and Peace were proposed. The Edward Lebrecht family wrote in a note that they submitted the name Peace because, as they expressed their thoughts, "Many times Jesus said to His disciples, 'Peace be with you or Peace be unto you.' And that we may serve Him peacefully and live in peace among each other and that Jesus may say unto all of us 'Peace be with you ' every time we enter the new church to worship." So it was on January afternoon, at the home of Mr. Fred Grote, at 207 W. Leith Street, that the congregation was established and the name Peace- Peace Evangelical Lutheran Church in its entirety- was selected. On that same day, a constitution which had been drawn up was signed. the invitation to be a charter member was then closed on November 24, 1946, with 76 persons finally recorded. Lester Zollinger was the first president of the congregation.

In the next few months I plan to highlight more of Pastor Strasen's history and remembrance of Peace. We have been through a lot this past year and have done an excellent job of continuing the history of Peace. We are joyful and thankful that Our Lord has blessed us.

PARISH HEALTH and WELLNESS

March is National Kidney Month

Did you know? You have two kidneys, each about the size of an adult fist, located on either side of the spine just below the rib cage. Although they are small, your kidneys perform many complex and vital functions that keep the rest of the body in balance. For example, kidneys:

- Help remove waste and excess fluid
- Filter the blood, keeping some compounds while removing others
- Control the production of red blood cells
- Make vitamins that control growth
- Release hormones that help regulate blood pressure and red blood cell production

Help regulate blood pressure and the amount of certain nutrients in the body, such as calcium and potassium.

Risks for Kidney Disease

- Diabetes
- High Blood Pressure
- Glomerulonephritis
- Age over 65
- Family History

Overuse of some over-the-counter pain killers (such as Ibuprofen, naproxen) and by taking illegal drugs such as heroin. Glomerular filtration rate (GFR) is the best estimate of kidney function. These simple tests can detect Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD): blood pressure, urine albumin and serum creatinine.

- Stage 1 CKD: eGFR 90 or Greater
- Stage 2 CKD: eGFR Between 60 and 89
- Stage 3 CKD: eGFR Between 30 and 59
- Stage 4 CKD: eGFR Between 15 and 29
- Stage 5 CKD: eGFR Less than 15

Diabetes and high blood pressure are the most common causes of CKD.

If you have diabetes or high blood pressure, working with your health care provider to keep your blood sugar and blood pressure under control is the best way to prevent kidney disease.

Living a healthy lifestyle can help prevent diabetes, high blood pressure and kidney disease, or help keep them under control. Follow these tips to lower your risk for kidney disease and the problems that cause it:

- Follow a low-salt, low-fat diet
- Exercise at least 30 minutes on most days of the week
- Have regular check-ups with your doctor
- Do not smoke or use tobacco
- Limit alcohol



away. Our sin is forgiven. Our shame is covered by the blood of *the* sacrificial Lamb of God.

The Father sends the Son to be the propitiation for our sins – in other words, to be the one who would atone for our sins and restore our broken relationship with God to the glory that it had before Adam and Eve's sin. Only one without sin could do that – only Jesus.

God's love frees us from sin and death. To twist God's love and use it as an excuse to continue in sin is to misunderstand what God's love really is and does. As the Apostle Paul says: "Are we to continue in sin so that grace may abound? By no means!" God's love confronts sin and death; how then can we twist that same love to justify sin and sinful behavior?

Instead of supporting or justifying sin, God's love destroys sin. May we, as His faithful children, boldly proclaim God's love in Christ Jesus to all sinners, trusting in God's power to support and guide us even as we are confronted with false ideas about God's love.


