PASTOR'S MESSAGE

*"I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live."
John 14:18-19 ESV*

Dear friends in Christ:

Throughout John 13-17, Jesus is preparing his disciples for his imminent departure from their midst. Jesus is preparing them for his own death on a cross. He tells them that he will be betrayed by one of them. He tells Peter that he himself will deny Jesus three times. Yet, while he knows that he will be dying soon, Jesus does not leave the disciples without hope. He promises them that he is going to prepare a place for them and that they, in fact, know the way to where he is going (it is through Him! John 14:6). Looking beyond his death, Jesus promises that he will send the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The Holy Spirit will guide them into all truth through faith.

Yet, even as Jesus speaks of his death, he makes a great promise to his disciples and us: "Because I live, you will live also." Jesus knows that his death is not an end. He knows that he will die and his body

will be placed in a tomb. Yet, he also knows that death will not have a hold on him – he will rise again. Not only will he rise to life, but those who follow him will also live in him. By faith, we believe and confess that we, too, will rise from death just as Jesus has risen. I believe "in the resurrection of the body" we confess in the Apostles' creeds (so also, "I look for the resurrection of the dead" in the Nicene Creed and "At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies" in the Athanasian Creed).

Because Jesus lives, we will live also in resurrected bodies on the Last Day.

Yet, we are not just waiting for the Last Day in order to experience the new life that God gives to those who confess the name of Jesus. God the Father, through His Son Jesus, gives us new life now. Paul states in Romans 6:4 – "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised

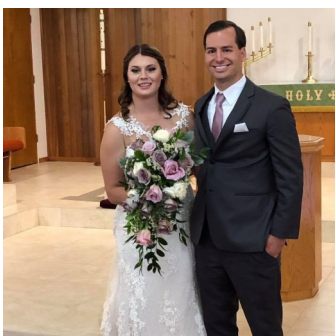


Former PEACE FIELDWORKER is MARRIED, ORDAINED

from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in *newness of life*" (ESV, emphasis added). This newness of life is not just something that we are waiting to receive on the Last Day; it is ours right now, each and every day. We are new creatures now: forgiven, renewed, reconciled to God, saved. We are all these things right now because of Jesus, because he has gone to the cross, because he has paid the penalty of sin on our behalf, because he has risen again.

Because Christ lives, we also will live, indeed! We live now as God's children, washed in the waters of Baptism, hearing and reading and understanding God's Holy Word, partaking of Christ's own body and blood in the Supper He prepares for us. Through the Means of Grace – through God's Word and Sacraments – we confess

the wonders of God's redemption in Jesus Christ our Savior. Through the Means of Grace, we receive the very gifts God delivers to us so that our new life in Christ Jesus is created and sustained by God's mighty hand.

Knowing that we live because of Christ Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit working in us, we live each day looking forward to and prepared for the fullness of our new life which will come on the Last Day. But we also live each day – right now – in the sure and certain hope that we are already made new in Jesus, ready to serve him in whatever circumstances come before us. Because he lives... we also live – both now and in the future.

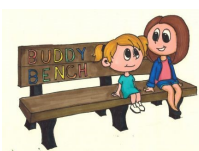

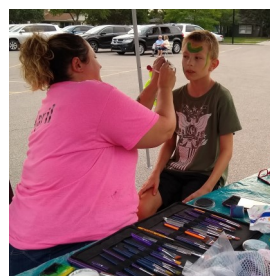
