"If we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed..." (Acts 4:9 ESV). After having healed a lame beggar (Acts 3:1-10) and restoring his ability to walk, Peter and John were arrested for teaching about Jesus at the temple. When questioned, Peter and John could have tried to isolate themselves from what they had done or listened to the Jewish Council that told them to keep quiet about Jesus (Acts 4:18). Yet, they did not keep silent. They had a greater truth to share. "This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:11-12 ESV).

This is a significant statement Peter makes at the end of his speech before the council: "There is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." Our culture seems to be moving in the direction that there is no specific path to salvation, if there is even such a thing as salvation. Yet, we stand on the truth of Peter's words that salvation comes only through Jesus. By faith in Jesus and the power of his life, death, and resurrection, we rest assured that he indeed saves us. This message is one that we are called to proclaim to all the world, with all boldness and confidence, just like Peter and John.
