PARISH HEALTH and WELLNESS

November is National COPD Awareness Month

With early diagnosis and treatment, people with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) can improve their quality of life and breathe better.

- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, or COPD, is a serious lung disease that makes it difficult to breathe. It's used to describe chronic bronchitis and emphysema.
- The best way to prevent COPD is to not smoke cigarettes. If someone is already a smoker, it is important to quit smoking. People who have COPD and quit smoking usually have marked reduction in the progression of the disease.
- Ongoing cough, shortness of breath, wheezing, and chest tightness are all symptoms of COPD. Symptoms can start slowly, so pay attention to what your body is telling you. Talk to a healthcare provider to learn more about COPD.
- COPD is diagnosed with a simple breathing test called spirometry, which can detect COPD before symptoms present. The hallmark of COPD is that the air leaves the lung slower than normal during a forced expiration.
- While COPD is most common among current or former smokers, about 15% of COPD cases are caused by exposure to certain dusts, gases, chemical fumes, or other pollutants in the workplace.
- Smoking cessation, immunization against influenza and pneumonia, and the use of various bronchodilator medications are effective treatments. In advanced stages, oxygen may be required, and in some cases, lung transplantation or surgical removal of localized emphysema may be employed.
- Pulmonary rehabilitation helps people with chronic breathing problems—such as COPD—function better in daily life. Patients work closely with a team of healthcare professionals to develop a program to help them learn to breathe better.
