Starting Point for Pastor and Caryl at Peace Lutheran Church- April 23, 2008

"Having called on the Lord, our God, for guidance and in the exercise of the authority with which He has vested His church on earth, the divine call was exercised by members of Peace Evangelical Lutheran Church." The Diploma of Vocation, the call document, was signed and forwarded to Reverend Paul Jerome Spira on April 23, 2008.

When Pastor Spira accepted the call to Peace there was much excitement and celebration! We were thankful and joyful to have a new Pastor to lead us into the future. This began a wonderful twelve year relationship between Peace congregation and Pastor and Caryl Spira. This relationship is also a glorious and meaningful chapter in the 74 year history of Peace.

Looking Back: Where did Pastor and Caryl come from before Peace?

Pastor Spira and Caryl are from Sun Prairie, Wisconsin, which is best known as the home of "Jimmy the Groundhog," famous every February 2nd. That places Jimmy the Groundhog in competition with "Punxsutawney Phil" from Pennsylvania.

At Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Sun Prairie, Pastor was very active in stewardship, elders, and capital funding. Both Pastor and Caryl taught Sunday school for many years.

Pastor earned his Bachelor degree from the University of Wisconsin-Stout. He later earned a MBA in Marketing from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1989. He completed his Master of Divinity degree in 2008 at the Fort Wayne Seminary. Prior to being called to the ministry, Pastor had 20 years of experience in marketing and worked in administration, organization, communication, and strategic planning.

Caryl has a Bachelor degree in Communication from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. When the Spiras moved to Fort Wayne, she began working at Indiana Purdue Fort Wayne (IPFW). As the Program Manager in the Outreach office for the College of ETCS, her responsibilities included event planning, volunteer coordination, newsletters, communications, website updates and media releases.

Pastor and Caryl started their ministry at age 47 and brought with them two wonderful children. At the time, Lizzy was 18 years old and attending Harvard, and Ethan, then 15, was attending Concordia High School. All of the members of the Spira family are very talented and passionate about what they do.






Peace received this card from a neighbor following the Woodhurst street construction:

Restorative Wellness

RESTORATIVE WELLNESS Pilot Program

Peace has become part of a Restorative Wellness Pilot Program that is offered by "Run Hard. Rest Well." founder Brenda Jank, and partially funded by The Lutheran Foundation. This 12-month program is intended for church leaders, school faculty and staff and other groups at Peace who may benefit as they transform from "running on empty" to being replenished and restored to be their best for those they love, lead and serve. This can be accomplished with God's design for work, rest and rhythm, highlighting four rhythms of restoration found in scripture: Sleep, Sabbath Keeping, Stillness (personal prayer) and Solitude (personal retreat).





Retreats were held recently with Peace Preschool and LSUS teachers & some of our Peace leadership. There is a retreat coming up soon for our Café staff as well. We will continue on this 12-month journey as we redefine rest, recognize red flags and the price tags of overload, practice stillness, find what refreshes us, and more as we implement the 4 Rhythms of Rest.

A simple and brief congregational assessment survey will be sent out via email in the upcoming weeks (hard copies will be available in narthex for those who don't have email) as part of this pilot program. Watch your email and bulletins for more information!

Parish Health and Wellness

In October, the following emphasis is being placed on Mental Health.

Mental Illness Awareness Week (Oct. 4–10)
National Depression Screening Day (Oct. 8)
World Mental Health Day (Oct. 10)

"And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:7).

As a Parish Nurse, wholistic care — body, mind and spirit — of self and for others is important. Perhaps we exercise and eat right for our physical body. We have daily devotions and attend church and Bible studies to help our spiritual growth. What are we doing for the wellbeing of our mind, our mental health?

You might think that you, your family or church family are not affected by mental health struggles, but we all are, in one way or another, at one time or another, in our life. Nearly 1 in 5 individuals in the United States experience mental illness. There are more than 200 classified forms of mental illness, with the most recognized ones being anxiety and panic disorders, bipolar disorder, depression, eating disorders, schizophrenia and substance abuse and addiction.

As I think about mental health, I am thankful to God. He cares for each of us and often works through individuals such as doctors, counselors, pastors, parish nurses, Sharistas and friends in Christ. God also uses medicines and exercise programs to strengthen our mental health. (There are various screening tools available on the Internet to use for yourself, family member or congregant, which often open conversation to seek professional care.) And of course, our Lord wants us to put Him first in our lives, to communicate with Him through prayer and to study His Word.

In Christian culture, mental illness has at times been seen as a sign of weak faith, lack of spiritual willpower or a source of shame. But the fact is that mental health conditions are no different than physical conditions. We wouldn't suggest that someone with cancer, diabetes or a heart condition should just pray about it without seeking treatment. But for many who struggle with depression or anxiety, or worse, that's what is often implied, or even said. What's more, they often face dehumanizing stigma and prejudice.

In addition to investing in churches, schools and organizations, The Lutheran Foundation created **LookUpIndiana.org**, a one-stop-shop website that offers real resources and help for mental illness. **LookUpIndiana.org** is a comprehensive resource that offers easy access to a wealth of mental and behavioral health information, a searchable database of service providers, information about upcoming events, and access to 24/7 help. Check it out.

WELLNESS CLASSES

To perform and promote faithfully the spiritual welfare of the members.....



Before I was called here our congregation was vacant for about two and a half years. So having Pastor Mann accept the call, and his being the very first call we issued, is a real blessing. I think we can and should feel very good about that and certainly we should give God all thanks and glory for taking care of us. But I also think that this blessing comes with a message. It reminds me of Jesus' parable of the wise and faithful manager in Luke 12 which he concludes with this statement: "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required..." (Luke 12:48a) We have been greatly blessed during my tenure as your pastor at Peace, and now God has blessed us with an undershepherd who has new and different skills and abilities. Our task moving forward is to once again ask the Lutheran question: What does this mean? What will our congregation and our ministry look like in the coming years? Having been in this same position a dozen years ago, I can say with confidence and enthusiasm that this is an exciting time to be a member at Peace!

Now many of you have expressed to me a mixed set of emotions about all this change going on. You're happy that Caryl and I get some time to relax, but sad that I'll no longer be your pastor. Believe me, I appreciate your heartfelt sentiments and can honestly say that I too struggle with the changes. But I also know that in the family of God, in the Body of Christ we call the church, there is no lasting sadness or separation from loved ones. In Christ we are indeed all one, and when we gather together around the Word of God and the sacrament of Jesus' body and blood we do so as one complete family unit. For me as a musician, I also experience this sense when singing or playing together in worship to God. Singing the words of ancient hymns I can still hear in my mind the voices of loved ones who no longer walk this earth but are now singing in the presence of Jesus. All of this echoes what Paul wrote to the people of Corinth, "Now I know in part; then I shall know fully" (1 Cor. 13:12a). This is the assurance we live with as Christians; no matter what trials or challenges or changes we go through in this life, we know there is much more to come...and it's going to be magnificent!



It's been a privilege to serve as Editor of the Peacefully Yours newsletter for the past five years. While it has definitely challenged me, I announced to our Board of Directors several months ago that the September/October issue would be my last one. With my husband joining me in retirement, I decided to also retire from this role.

So "What happens next for the PY?" As with any time of change it is a great opportunity to step back and look at what we're doing now, to ask if it still makes sense, and to assess if there's a better way moving forward. A newsletter called *Peacefully* Yours has been produced by this congregation for most of her 70+ years. It has taken on different formats, timetables, and methods of delivery, but the name remained the same. The current format of PY was designed many years ago by Peace member Gretchen Hollman using Microsoft Publisher.

But much has changed in the world of computers and desktop publishing since the mid-2000's, and there are far more efficient ways to assemble, organize, and distribute information today. Pastor and I had a very nice phone meeting with Gretchen to talk newsletters (among many other things!), and it was exciting to see and hear what she is now doing for the church she serves. Of course that congregation is many times the size of Peace, but we got some very good ideas.




This current format of PY is a beautiful church newsletter and a wonderful way to capture and share about the ministry of Peace - in full color! But the production of this format takes an incredible amount of hours, and honestly the software I've used for years no longer is compatible and can't support what we're trying to do. These last two issues had to be manually scanned and printed which produced less natural color, scan lines and oddly placed spaces in the middle of articles. So even if I was staying on as Editor, I would have to change how we put the newsletter together. While there is still a need for some printed copies of PY, many people today prefer to get their information electronically by phone or computer. That's how many churches today distribute information, and it's faster, easier, and more cost efficient.

With Pastor Mann beginning his ministry in October, I wouldn't expect that creating a brand new PY format is going to be among his top priorities. However he will have experience and ideas from his past congregations that can assist in figuring this out. Thankfully we have other means of getting information distributed in our congregation, most notably the weekly Share, Serve, Celebrate announcement page that's inserted in our bulletins. If however desktop publishing and/or communication skills are gifts you possess and would like to takeover doing the PY, let me know!


